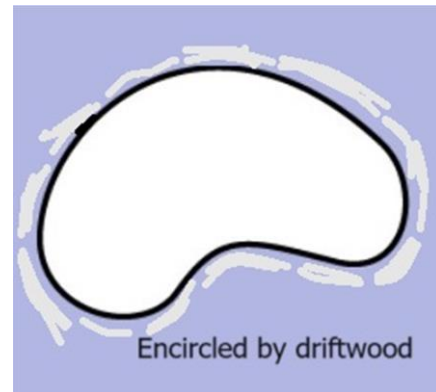
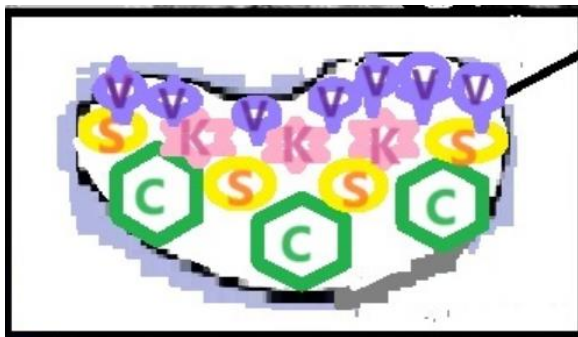

Driftwood encircles the planting site, can it be collected and stored here for planting day? Critical as a site barrier to weed-eaters and mowers and free. Fun activity for a school club! "Get your homework turned in people!" (Mr Hatfield or Ms. Buckley).

These plants do not need any soil amendments. One inch of mulch would be beneficial. May need a little water the first summer, depending on the length of summer drought. As Ceanothus gets larger, less North-wind tolerant plants can be added.
