I object to the changes proposed and described by the Planning Manager. After watching the Planning Commission hearing, it was evident that not enough written information was given to the Commissioners to know what the changes were replacing, let alone concerned Bandon citizens who will be affected. The difficulty in attending Zoom meetings is not sufficient to inform the public. I was unable to view many Zoom meetings and my complaint received no call back on how I could view. It seems the City is using Facebook to inform the public. I know of people who refuse to join Facebook or do not have computer access.

I noticed that Attorney Robert (Robin) Miller submitted a rather strong letter of concern regarding changes to the Code during the April 28, 2022 hearing. It was not in the packet, he did not read it, and it was not inserted or attached to the meeting's minutes. It seems the Planning office does not want the public to know of legitimate objections to the proposed changes.

I worked for the City for twelve years, most of it in the City's planning department recording and transcribing Planning Commission and other Commission meetings. All changes to the ordinances involved workshops, public forums, lots of public input before submitting their recommendations to the City Council. Bandon is a unique and beautiful small coastal town because of ordinances which have managed to keep it that way. Claudine Hundhausen voiced to the effect that our ordinances are not dirty, therefore no clean-up is necessary.
